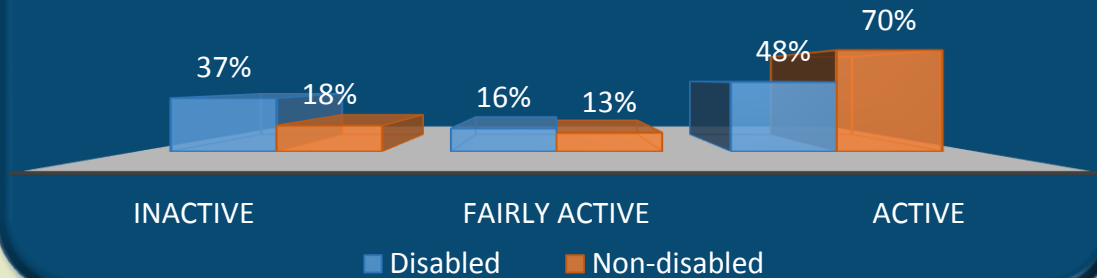

What barriers stop disabled people from exercising?⁴

- 53%** said "No activities suitable for me"
- 46%** said "Fear of not being welcome or no suitable environment"
- 38%** said "Support with travel or motivation to take part"
- 38%** said "Too far to travel"

Helping disabled people be more active⁵

- Warm & accessible swimming pools
- Support, encouragement & equipment to assist people
- Disability & deaf awareness training for leisure staff
- More activities for older people
- Introductory tour, with others, to show what is possible

5 Most prevalent conditions in Surrey²

- 76,667** Some or severe hearing loss
 - 75,217** Physical disability
 - 24,536** Diabetes
 - 7,086** Autistic Spectrum
 - 3,959** Moderate/severe learning disability
- 13.5%** of Surrey's population say they have a disability³
